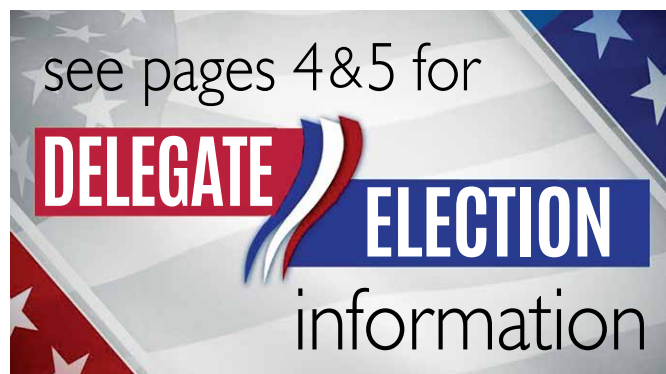

This year, the 38th UAW Constitutional Convention will be held July 25-29, 2022 at Huntington Place (formerly Cobo Hall) in Detroit. Local Union members elect their Convention Delegates.



Local Union Delegate numbers and votes are based on membership size.

The Delegate Election will be held May 23-25, 2022 at UAW Region 1/ UAW Local 400 (see notices on pages 4 and 5 of this issue of the *Local Motion* for more information).

Additionally, members may submit Constitutional Resolution forms to their respective unit Chairperson for any UAW Constitutional changes/additions/edits that they would like to be considered to be voted on at the convention. You may see your Chairperson or find the form at:

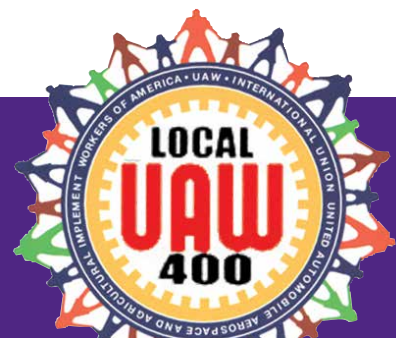

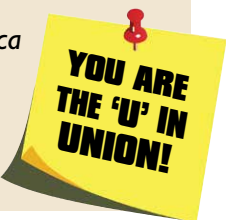

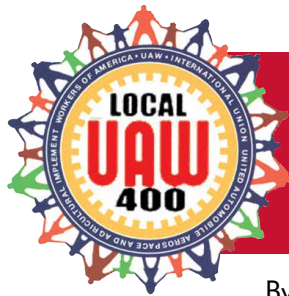

2022 International UAW Constitutional Convention DELEGATE ELECTION NOTICE

NOMINATIONS

By Joint Council action on March 23, 2022, the International **UAW CONVENTION DELEGATE ELECTION** will take place on Monday, May 23, 2022, Tuesday, May 24, 2022, and Wednesday, May 25, 2022. Should a **RUN-OFF** be necessary, it will be held on Tuesday, May 31, 2022, and Wednesday, June 1, 2022.

All members in good standing for one (1) year immediately preceding the first day of the month in which the Convention is held (July 1, 2021) and shall also have been a member of Local 400 for three months immediately preceding the first day of the month in which the Convention is held (April 1, 2022) are declared nominated. Nominations are open as of Wednesday, April 20, 2022 and Thursday, April 21, 2022. Nominations may be dropped off at the Local 400 office during business hours from 2:00 p.m. - 10:00 p.m. on Wednesday, April 20, 2022 and 6:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. Thursday, April 21, 2022. Also, acceptance may be made by **CERTIFIED OR REGISTERED LETTER** addressed to the Chairperson of the Election Committee, 50595 Mound Road, Utica, MI 48317.

ALL NOMINATIONS MUST BE SUBMITTED DURING THIS NOMINATION PERIOD BY THE NOMINEE.

Deadline for acceptance is 4:00 p.m., Thursday, April 21, 2022. If mailed, must be **POSTMARKED NOT LATER THAN MIDNIGHT**, Thursday, April 21, 2022.

A candidate must include the following information with acceptance: **NAME, SOCIAL SECURITY**

NUMBER, CLASSIFICATION, SENIORITY, SHIFT, ADDRESS, and POSITION ACCEPTING.

A candidate should print name as she/he wishes it to appear on the ballot and **SIGN** the nomination acceptance. The nomination forms are available at the Local 400 office.

Although all members are automatically nominated by Joint Council action, a member may exercise her/his right to personally nominate a member of her/his choice for office. It is the nominator's responsibility to notify the nominee that she/he has been nominated. It is the obligation of the nominee to accept and sign such nomination and place her/his name in nomination within the two (2) day nomination period.

The drawing for candidates' position on the ballot will be held on Thursday May 5, 2022 at 12:00 noon, at the Local 400 Union Hall at 50595 Mound Road, Utica, Michigan. Any candidate wishing to withdraw her/his name should do so prior to the drawing, in writing.

Ballots will be counted immediately after the closing of the polls on Wednesday, May 25, 2022.

Rules of Conduct for the Convention Delegate Election

1. Voting will be by secret ballot.
2. Voter must show positive identification and sign registration card at time of voting.
3. Each candidate will be allowed a challenger during election and during counting. Challenger must be a Local 400 member.
4. Challenger's names must be submitted to the Election Committee no later than 12:00 noon on Thursday, May 5, 2022.
5. All new members who have signed dues authorization forms and are "members in good standing" are eligible to vote.
6. A candidate shall have the right to submit her/his commonly known name as she/he wishes it to appear on the ballot.
7. Anyone wishing to withdraw must do so by 11:00 a.m. on Thursday, May 5, 2022, in writing. Any corrections, misspellings, etc. must be received no later than this date and time also.
8. Results will be tabulated by the Election Committee after the closing of all the polls on Wednesday, May 25, 2022.
9. No member is eligible to be a candidate as a delegate to the Convention unless s/he has been a member in continuous good standing in the International Union for twelve (12) months immediately preceding the first day of the month in which the Convention is held (July 2022) and s/he must also have been a member of Local 400 for three (3) months immediately preceding the first day of the month in which the Convention is held.
10. The Financial Secretary may be present at the polls at the time of voting for the purpose of guarding the records and books for which her/his office is responsible.
11. Members of the Election Committee shall remain neutral and not campaign or favor any candidate.
12. Candidates may observe the printing of any ballots printed in-house. Contact the Election Committee or Local 400 Recording Secretary for time and date after the drawing for candidate's position on the ballot on Thursday, May 5, 2022, but before close of regular business hours on Tuesday, May 17, 2022.
13. All reasonable requests for absentee ballots will be met for members (on union or company business only) by contacting the Election Committee or Local 400 Recording Secretary before Tuesday, May 17, 2022.
14. Campaign mailing request must be in writing delivered by regularly used or dependable means to the Election Committee or Local 400 Recording Secretary. Local 400 will comply with any reasonable request by a candidate to distribute campaign literature at the candidate's expense.

Dear Local 400 Brothers and Sisters,

For a Better Local, Union, and Nation

Ask any high school senior studying government about the importance of voting. You will probably get a straight, undiluted answer that the political process is how a free society chooses its leaders. At their age, the cynicism bred by age has yet to creep into their young minds. As adults, we can do well to rid ourselves of that same cynicism and engage in the voting process.

In Michigan, a simple comparison between the results of the 2016 and 2020 presidential elections show how a higher turnout, even a marginal one, can make a difference.

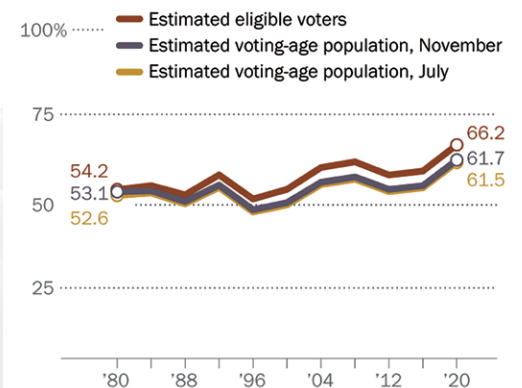

Greetings Brothers & Sisters,

Spring is finally upon us. I know the majority of us are looking forward to some warm weather. With that being said, we know how fast the warmer months seem to go by and this year in particular with our situation at Romeo, the months will fly by even faster.

The UAW Bargaining Committee and our Local 400 Officers understand all of the questions and concerns that our members have pertaining to our plant idling/closing. We have had multiple meetings with our Region and International Reps., all the way up to our Director and Vice President. Not that they need to be reminded. We can report to this membership with 100% certainty that Region 1 Director James Harris and UAW Vice President Chuck Browning understand what we are up against and have our best interest at heart. They have given us an open door with open ears whenever we call them.

I must remind this membership that although we continue to try and convince Ford Motor Company to reverse the decision for REP and put some work

in our beloved facility, it is our job to prepare this membership for the other scenarios we face. As we move throughout this process, we will

have meetings here on site regarding buyouts, bridges, and job opportunities through the hierarchy spelled out in our National contract. When meeting dates are finalized, we will post them throughout the plant.

We are pleased to announce that we re-opened the REP fitness center at the beginning of February. Fitness centers were closed throughout the company during the height of the COVID-19 pandemic.

As of March 4th, the protocol for wearing masks has changed to wearing one voluntarily, if you so choose. They are still located at the doorway entrances and are also available in your departments. As long as Macomb County remains in the "Orange" status or better, this new policy will remain.

President Verellen and I had the opportunity to attend a meeting in Dearborn on Friday, March 18th. We wanted to pass along the joint message from UAW President Ray Curry, UAW Vice President Chuck Browning and Ford Motor Company CEO Jim Farley of their gratitude to the membership for working safely throughout this pandemic.

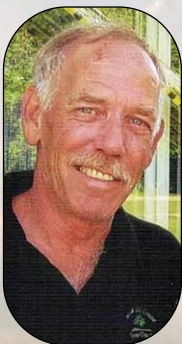
