#### **RUN-OFF ELECTION (if necessary)**



No member shall be eligible to run for office until he/she has been a member in continuous good standing in the Local Union for (1) year immediately prior to the nomination.


## GENERAL ELECTION - 2023

### UAW LOCAL 1264 ELECTION RULES

The Election of Officers, Shop Committeepersons, Executive Board Members and Stewards will be held on **Thursday May 4, 2023**. Voting hours are as follows: **Active Members vote 5:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. at the Sterling Stamping Plant. Inactive Members, Laid-Off Members, or those on Medical Leave, Vacation, leave of absence or PA Days will vote from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. at Local 1264 Hall on voting day.**

**Retirees vote from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. at Local 1264 Hall on Thursday, May 4, 2023.** Run-Off, if necessary, will be held on **Thursday, June 8, 2023**, at the same locations and times.

1. Each voter **MUST** be a member in good standing.
2. Each voter **MUST** show his or her **Badge, Membership Card, Drivers License or State ID**. No voter will be permitted to vote unless he or she has one of these items of identification.
3. Before a voter votes, he or she **MUST** sign their signature on a Voter's Registration Card.
4. All disputes arising out of the election and its procedures will be referred to and acted upon by all seven (7) members of the Election Committee.
5. All electioneering must be done outside the polls and not closer than 25 feet from the place of voting.
6. Each candidate will be allowed one **(1) Challenger** at each appropriate polling place and at the place designated for counting. Each Challenger will be issued a badge by the Election Committee at the polling place. **Each candidate should submit the name of his or her challenger to the Local Union Hall by Thursday, April 20, 2023.**
7. If a voter's name does not appear on the voting list at the polls, he or she may vote a Challenged Ballot. However, the voter must put his/her name, dept. and badge number on the outside envelope in order for his/her ballot to be checked. The ballot will be sealed in a plain small envelope, which will be placed in the larger envelope until the record can be checked.
8. **No Absentee Ballots will be accepted.**
9. The votes will be counted immediately upon closing of the polls and results will be posted at the end of each election.
10. No disorderly persons, intoxicants or obscene language will be permitted in the polling places or the places of the counting of the ballots.
11. No candidate in an election should serve as a Challenger for another candidate in the same election – during the original vote tabulations or during a recount.
12. Individual requests for a recount of votes by other than a bona fide candidate relative to his respective office, or his duly authorized Challenger, shall be considered improper.
13. **NO election campaign** material will be posted on the outside of the building, fences, gates, lamp columns or doors.
14. **NO DISPERSING or DRINKING of INTOXICATING BEVERAGES** in the parking lot or plant.
15. All Challengers **MAY** be at the polls at **4:00 AM** to check the voting process.
