Greetings:

UAW Region 1 is pleased to announce our Winter 2023 class schedule! Active and retired members are invited to join us for classes beginning Tuesday, February 7, 2023. We are offering four class options, each of which will meet for four sessions on either Tuesdays or Thursdays. Participants will have a choice between morning (10:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m.) or evening (5:00 p.m.-7:00 p.m.) class meetings. Participants must attend three out of the four class sessions to receive a Certificate of Completion. We will host a combined graduation celebration during a final session on Thursday, March 9, 2023.

Class offerings this fall include:

TUESDAY CLASSES – AM or PM: (February 7, 14, 21, 28 & Thursday, March 9)

- Grievance Handling: This course teaches the skills needed to represent workers with grievances.
 Topics include: what is and is not a grievance, proper grievance investigation techniques, and written grievance presentation skills.
- Personal Preparation in a Bargaining Year: This class will provide a foundational overview for
 members to prepare themselves for a major contract bargaining year. First, we'll review the basics
 of collective bargaining and strikes. Then, we'll discuss personal financial preparation, providing
 common sense budgeting tips, strategies for building an emergency fund, and simple advice for how
 to avoid financial pitfalls and debt. Participants should walk away with strategies to prepare
 themselves personally for the variety of scenarios that can unfold during a bargaining year.

THURSDAY CLASSES - AM or PM: (February 9, 16, 23, March 2 & 9)

- Building an Effective Standing Committee: Standing committees are the lifeblood of our union. In
 this class, we'll provide an overview of the important role that each of the 11 constitutionally
 mandated standing committees play in our union, offering guidance for how to effectively structure
 and operate committees. Importantly, we will brainstorm ideas for activities committees can
 organize, especially emphasizing the important role each committee might play in the event of a
 strike.
- Our Changing Global Economy: This class will build members' understanding of changing power
 dynamics throughout our global economy. We will discuss the impact of new technologies in the
 various industries that we work in, especially focusing on developments with electric vehicle
 manufacturing. We will also discuss the impacts of trade policy and other legislative issues that
 affect us as union members. Members will gain a well-rounded understanding of what globalization
 is, how our global economy is changing, and where our union fits into it all.

All classes are offered at <u>no cost</u> and will be held at UAW Region 1. Please read the below instructions carefully as our registration process has changed.
